Sermon Title: The Rich Man and Lazarus

Scripture: Luke 16: 19-31

And besides all this, between us and you a great chasm has been set in place, so that those who want to go from here to you cannot, nor can anyone cross over from there to us.'

"He answered, 'Then I beg you, father, send Lazarus to my family, for I have five brothers. Let him warn them, so that they will not also come to this place of torment.'

- "Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the Prophets; let them listen to them."
- "'No, father Abraham,' he said, 'but if someone from the dead goes to them, they will repent.'
- "He said to him, 'If they do not listen to Moses and the Prophets, they will not be convinced even if someone rises from the dead."

John Emerson wrote this message back in May of 1980. He gave the office a few of his writings for "space filler". Since we are starting the month of May and there is a little space left in this bulletin, we thought it would be nice to have a little message from John. John's heart was pure gold!



"That they may be one---"

That was Jesus' prayer for unity concluding with the thought, "that they might know that you sent me". In short, Jesus prayed for unity among his followers just as He and the Father are united.

In Ephesians 4, after exhorting Christians to walk "worthy of their calling", Paul speaks of "endeavoring to keep the unity of the Spirit". Then he proceeds with the thought of a "oneness" in body, Spirit, hope, faith, baptism, Lord and God.

Back to verse 3 of Ephesians 4. Endeavoring is an interesting word. Webster defines it as trying hard; striving. Either of these implies a working against resistance. So it appears to me that Paul says unity must be striven for - that it comes, not easily, but with the perfecting of each of us.

Ephesians 4:13-14 speaks of the unity of the faith, and the knowledge that brings us towards maturity or perfection like unto Christ.

In verse 14 he enlarges upon his desire that we be one. And that for the reason we be no more "children, tossed to and fro and carried about with every wind of doctrine".

Dear folks, we all know there is every wind of doctrine (teaching) abroad today. And if we treasure the unity that Paul speaks of and Christ prayed for we must be prepared to make some real choices.

Rest assured there's no problem in God's plan. The real test is how we respond to His teachings. He is the author of unity- not confusion.
