#### A Response to Jen Hatmaker

Last Week, Jen Hatmaker, a Christian author and influencer, shared some upsetting thoughts on social media. I felt sympathy and upset mixed with a desire to push back. I won't paraphrase her thoughts well, so check out her comments on Instagram. Here is what I heard; Jen went through a heart wrenching divorce that made Church attendance difficult and painful. It was more than just the divorce, but it was the last straw. She is (temporarily?) leaving the Church, but not Jesus. She, like many, has problems with the "Church's" power, greed, and lies.

I really appreciate her honestly. In many ways the Church is not what it is supposed to be. Its values are off, and it seems more interested in comfort and status quo than healing a broken world. However, when we say "the Church" it is often stereotypes and generalizations; it is not fair to judge the entire Church based on the behavior of some Christians. Still, I see this post, (and all the likes and positive comments it garnered) as a wakeup call to the Church. We need to be a place where it is safe to be broken. It should be more like an AA meeting than a museum for Holy, put together, people. We must empathetically acknowledge how hard it is for some to attend Church. I fear some (like Jen) quit attending Church during Covid, and realized it wasn't doing much for them, so why return? This challenges me as a Church leader to rethink what we are doing with our Worship/Bible Class time and find meaningful ways to be a Christ follower outside of those times.

She really gives herself and others license to not attend Church services. She says that her "church" has become time with family, friends, and meditation outdoors; no need to meet God at a building. I agree, you can powerfully meet God in places other than a Church building. However, I fear this hyper individualistic trend of moving away from Church community is tragic. A lot of people seem to love Jesus but dislike his Church...you cannot really do that; it is a packaged deal. When you are baptized into Christ you are baptized into his Church, his community, his people. You cannot be a Christian in isolation or only commune with the Christians you like. We need the Church, we need accountability, we need relationships, we need corporate worship. Admittedly, it all may need reform, but don't leave! Be the change you want to see.
