Sermon Title: Submissive Living

Scripture: I Peter 3: 1-9

Wives, in the same way submit yourselves to your own husbands so that, if any of them do not believe the word, they may be won over without words by the behavior of their wives, when they see the purity and reverence of your lives. Your beauty should not come from outward adornment, such as elaborate hairstyles and the wearing of gold jewelry or fine clothes. Rather, it should be that of your inner self, the unfading beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit, which is of great worth in God's sight. For this is the way the holy women of the past who put their hope in God used to adorn themselves. They submitted themselves to their own husbands, like Sarah, who obeyed Abraham and called him her lord. You are her daughters if you do what is right and do not give way to fear. Husbands, in the same way be considerate as you live with your wives, and treat them with respect as the weaker

partner and as heirs with you of the gracious gift of life, so that nothing will hinder your prayers.

Finally, all of you, be like-minded, be sympathetic, love one another, be compassionate and humble. Do not repay evil with evil or insult with insult. On the contrary, repay evil with blessing, because to this you were called so that you may inherit a blessing.

God's preferences are not mine, nor does he always agree with me. We can all be grumpy about newer songs being too simple or theologically lacking or complain about older songs being "boring" or using archaic language. We need to realize there is value in all of them, and we all have emotional connections with certain songs that may impact and improve our worship in different ways. The variety is a good thing! It corrects weaknesses in our style and theology over time and keeps us from just getting stuck on one time period or whatever is newest and cutting edge. Worship is not about my preferences, so let's make allowances for a variety of styles that help different people to connect with God.


#### **Children's Ministry News**
