


Ladies Committee Sign-ups

It's weird how often there is news that the whole world is excited and worked up about, but then the next week we completely forget about it. There are so many front-page stories that end up with their resolutions barely reported on the back pages. I suspect there are several reasons for this: we have short attention spans, the media tends to report what gets clicks, and perhaps sometimes the end of the story doesn't fit an agenda, so it doesn't get reported. There is one interesting story from a few months back that I just dug up the resolution to. Remember back in October when a group of missionaries were kidnapped and ransomed by a gang in Haiti? They wanted 1 million dollars per person! That is a steep price for any Church or Missionary Society. The missionaries were associated with Christian Aid Ministries which is an Anabaptist group (Amish and Mennonite). Well, they held them too long and nothing interesting was happening, plus none of the missionaries were super attractive or had a big social media following. So, the media moved on and so did most other people.

Fortunately, in mid-December they were set free! This got news coverage but nothing like the fanfare at the beginning of the crisis. It also left out important details, did they escape? Were they set free? Was a ransom paid? Later in January it was discovered that a "Good Samaritan" came in and helped with negotiations and paid a ransom (I doubt it was 17 million). There are some good reasons to not give this as much coverage. It's a bad look for the U.S. government because they did nothing: Haitian gangs used to be afraid to mess with Americans for fear of the government. It also encourages future kidnappings since the gang got paid.

Whether your media source is right or left wing, there is always an agenda in what stories get airtime and the spin put on those stories. Our God is filled with Truth and Light. As His people we need to make sure we seek truth in the media we take in. Don't just receive your news, investigate it. This means looking to see underlying goals and agendas, but also not just seeking the news that affirms our beliefs and tells us what we want to hear. May we be people who seek Truth and refuse to be manipulated.
