

Choose Your News – by Brady Horner

It looks to me like we are at a boiling point as a nation. Americans have generally distrusted and complained about institutions for a long time. But now there is a push to tear these institutions down: the church, the go vernment, and public education. I saw a news piece blaming the Democrats for all of this. It listed this latest breach of Supreme Court integrity (the leak about the overturning of Roe v. Wade) as a direct attack on the government institution and claimed our institutions will eventually fail. That's fair, but it was a group of conservatives who physically disrupted a joint session of Congress to stop the election process (because they didn't trust the institution). So, right, or left, both don't fully trust government institutions. It's different aspects and branches that we don't trust. It's a bit of an overgeneralization but we seem to trust media and politicians more when they tell us what we want to hear.

The internet has given more freedom of press than ever before, giving essentially anyone a platform. This has helped us to expose institutions and corruption (I'm thinking politicians, government, and Church) and given us more reason to distrust institutions/authority. Shining a light on corruption is good, but at the same time it has robbed us of any foundational source to trust and rely on. So, we default to believing what we want to believe, what is most convenient, what affirms our current beliefs, what is repeated to us the most, or maybe even what is cool...what a mess.

I don't have a solid answer for how to handle this. Complete objectivity in our approach to politics, culture, and even the scriptures is impossible. No matter how hard we try, we will be impacted by our surrounding environment. TV, social media, news, friends, artists, and influencers will impact our views. As Christians, we must be careful to identify the underlying agenda of the media we consume. Often it's more to get clicks than give you solid factual information. Are we in news/"friend" echo chambers that just tell us what we want to hear? We need way more no screen time. We need to teach our kids how to identify and navigate ways in which the media is manipulating them. I want God and His Word to shape us, but in a media saturated world, we must be much more intentional about listening for His voice.
