

John vs. the Synoptics — by Brady Horner

Have you ever tried to read through the Gospels side by side and compare them? Okay, probably not because few people have time for things like this anymore, but it's interesting. You will discover that Matthew, Mark, and Luke are often very similar, even word for word similar. You will also find that John is very different. It's clear they are still talking about the same God, the same Jesus, but different stories, teachings, historical characters, and miracles. Most scholars believe that John was written after the synoptic gospels (Matthew, Mark, and Luke) and that he was familiar with at least some of them.

There are some interesting differences in John. Jesus never tells a parable in John, but it is the only gospel where he teaches with the "I Am" statements. In John the opponents are not identified as the Pharisees but more generalized as "the Jews", which some have argued has contributed to anti-Semitism. While Jesus's miracles in John are similar, the only two miracles it shares that match the other three Gospels are the feeding of the 5000 and the resurrection. We also get to hear from some different disciples in John. In the synoptics it seems mostly about Peter, James, and John; but in John we hear from Philip, Nathaniel, "doubting" Thomas, and the recurring character Nicodemus.

I've heard that our concept of Jesus, his behavior and character, comes more from John than the other gospels. Some think he is warmer in John than in the other gospels, but I'm not sure if I agree. If you are watching The Chosen, you may notice that a lot of it comes from John as opposed to the other gospels; I haven't done the math on this, but the John episodes in the show are very memorable to me. I like to think of John as filling in the blanks and sharing some of the neat stuff that the other gospels missed. The book closes saying, "Jesus did many other things as well. If every one of them were written down, I suppose that even the whole world would not have room for the books that would be written." So, I guess there are still some great stories that we won't know until we are with Jesus. Until then, I challenge you to pick up John and read. It's a great book and we will be using it as we walk through the "Breaking the Fourth Wall" series.


