<u>Jesus Breaking the 4th Wall — by Brady Horner</u>

Probably the most famous verse in the Bible is John 3: 16: perhaps because it is a nice summary of the gospel, or because some crazy guy in the '80s named Rock'n Rollen popularized it at sporting events. The larger context of the verse shows us a beautiful moment. Here a prominent Pharisee named Nicodemus comes to secretly seek Jesus's wisdom at night. Nicodemus admits that Jesus is clearly from God because no one could perform the miraculous signs Jesus did. Thus, it's likely all the Pharisees knew this, but they didn't like what Jesus was teaching, and what they would have to give up, so they blatantly rejected him (perhaps we do the same).

In John 3 Jesus tells Nicodemus about entering the Kingdom of God by being born again. In verses 16-21 Jesus is still teaching Nicodemus, but it feels almost as if he is breaking the fourth wall, turning and speaking directly to the reader. You can feel Christ's invitation to future readers in statements like "whoever believes in him shall not perish" and "whoever believes in him is not condemned". He is not only speaking to Nicodemus, but to "whoever" meaning me and you. It is an invitation not to simply believe in God, but to believe that Christ and his works are from God; to believe that Christ is the Light and to "live by the truth" and come into the light. It's an invitation to do what many Pharisees couldn't, to admit our brokenness and accept God's saving grace.

John 3 doesn't tell us how the episode ends. The show *The Chosen* has an interesting take (guess) at how Nicodemus responds. However, Nicodemus is a recurring character in John, and he is clearly a Jesus sympathizer. In John 7 he attempts to talk some sense into the Pharisees who are ready to condemn and arrest Jesus. Then in John 19 he helps prepare and bury Christ's body. I'm not sure if he fully accepted Christ's invitation (that is offered to all of us) and remained a Pharisee, or if he tried to do what many of us attempt to do; accept Christ's invitation without changing who we are and how we live. What areas of your life need to be exposed, or given up, to "the light" in order to fully accept Christ's invitation?

So, he invites the outcasts of society, who all come and enjoy the banquet. Jesus wants everyone to come to his feast in heaven because Jesus includes everyone.

Summary verse: "Don't be selfish; don't try to impress others. Be humble, thinking of others as better than yourselves." (Philippians 2:3)
