

<u>Jesus Was a Legalist? — by Brady Horner</u>

Sometimes I'll hear someone say, "Jesus was a legalist." It's usually said defensively or preemptively when discussing some beloved closely held doctrine...so, it's usually said to justify oneself (see Luke 10: 29). Every time I hear someone say this, the prejudice in me thinks "Who told you that?!" because I just can't see how someone would ever deduce that from objectively reading a gospel. They must have read it on a blog or heard it from a popular podcast or preacher. You must dance around scripture, pick and choose a few, and ignore a whole lot more to deduce that "Jesus was a legalist." Perhaps it is from picking out a few verses where Jesus insists on obedience (maybe his discussion with the Pharisee/expert in the law in Luke 10, but then this would completely miss the point of the ensuing parable of the Good Samaritan), or maybe on all sides there is confusion on the definition of a legalist.

To say "Jesus was a legalist" and thus affirm your own legalism is to miss one of the great points of the Gospel; turns out you can be real sinful and still follow most of these Old Testament laws. My favorite example Jesus gives is how Pharisees could dodge taking care of their parents in their old age by saying the money that should go to them was Corban (devoted to God), but could use that money almost however they wanted (see Mark 7: 9-13). They are essentially following the law but are clearly being scummy. Rule lists and obedience to them are good, tradition and Biblical law are good, but what we really need, and what God really wants, are changed hearts. If our hearts are transformed, we won't have to constantly check rule lists. This take still demands obedience, but it comes from love, not blind adherence to a rule list.

What all this really appears to be is doing some gymnastics with the scriptures to make them affirm what we are already doing. Let's face it, this is something of which we are all guilty. We are human and it is impossible to read the Bible with pure objectivity. Let's read the Bible holistically, for all its worth. In this way it safeguards us from watering it down and self-justification and allows it to make claims on our lives and who we are as God's people.




Family Retreat
