

# Objective Reading of Scripture? — by Brady Horner

"Churches of Christ only do what the Bible says." I remember how offended my Baptist friend was when I condescendingly spoke those words to him. Apparently, a ton of Christian groups only go by the Bible! We just differ in interpretation, how it is applied, and what Scriptures are favored and hold the most weight. I love how we (Churches of Christ) hold Scripture in such a high regard and use it as a binding constant that transcends the whims of culture and the power of man-made leadership. I love that our secondary founder, Alexander Campbell, wanted to objectively read Scripture as if he had never picked up a Bible. That is a noble thing to attempt, but we must admit, we can't completely do that. We are conditioned by our culture, our history, and our personal experiences. We will always read Scripture through a subjective lens, and thus come to different conclusions.

Some of our senior members likely remember going through the "Missionary Societies Controversy" within the Churches of Christ. Most of us are shocked that anyone would ever have an issue with a missionary group. From what I gather there were a few issues at hand. Some argued that they weren't authorized and were thus man-made additions. They also felt that it was a "waste" of funds. On top of that was a suspicion of any man-made institutions like colleges. Ultimately all this came down to a fear of a centralized power that would trump local church authority. The Baptists went through a similar controversy! Today's Missionary Baptists were the "liberals" okay with Missionary Societies and Temperance groups, while the Primitive Baptists are not involved with any of those. In fact, Primitive Baptists might play nice with our "Non-Institutional" Churches of Christ. Both groups are a cappella only, don't have Bible class, have minister apprenticeships rather than seminary, and do not participate with missionary societies. The Primitive Baptists had the same concern of the non-institutional churches. They wanted to preserve local church autonomy. They, like many Americans, were afraid of a strong central authority, like a pope or a king, telling them what to do.

I view these controversies as a good example of churches being shaped more by their history and environment than an objective reading of Scripture. While I believe local church autonomy is good, and there are some scriptural arguments for it, there are also plenty of examples of early Church cooperation and centralized authority (The Council of Jerusalem and the Edict of James in Acts 15, multiple Churches sent money to Jerusalem in Romans 15:26, the Pastoral Letters set the example of non-local evangelists appointing elders). I can't believe all these people upset about "man-made additions" never criticized our "unbiblical", historically and environmentally formed, popular election of elders. I'm not suggesting we change any of our "unbiblical" practices, but I am suggesting that we acknowledge we aren't as Bible accurate as we think. We need to stop condemning people who interpret things differently, and appreciate that there is more freedom in Christ than we think.





### **Children's Ministry News**

This is the last week of our current study, "Digging into the Heart of God." The final lesson is found in Revelation 21. In this passage, the Bible describes what heaven is like. It's a beautiful, golden city full of light from God Himself! There isn't any pain, sadness, or dying. And best of all, we'll live forever with Jesus! As we close our study of the characteristics and nature of God, we are reminded that God is eternal, and He promises us eternity with Him.

Next week is the Marriage Retreat weekend. With many teachers away, the youth will assist with classes. Birth to three will meet in their regular classrooms. The west hallway children will have combined classes with activities led by our teens.
